# **School Uniform**

The children are looking very smart this week in their new school uniform. Please remember how important it is that you send them in looking smart and in the correct uniform. If they aren't in the correct uniform, they are less likely to follow the school rules because they know what the rules around uniform are, and they are learning that you think it is alright to overstep the boundaries.

The things to take particular notice of are that they are wearing PLAIN gold stud earrings, like the ones in the picture, and no makeup or hair gel. They also need plain black shoes and black or brown tights or socks. Also please would parents make sure that if their children's hair is longer than collar length (girls or boys), it is tied up with a yellow, brown, black or white, discrete hair band.




# **World Championship Medal Winner**
