Attendance

After Christmas, I will be sending a letter home for every child in the school, so that all parents know what their child's attendance has been like since they started Our Lady's School. Attendance has been more difficult to monitor over the last few years because of the impact of COVID. However, we are starting to see a pattern of some children underperforming because they have missed so much school. This is time they have missed on top of lockdowns. I cannot emphasise the importance of school attendance at the moment especially when we don't know if we will be forced to isolate legally. It is very difficult for children to learn if they continually miss lessons. We just don't have the resources to keep going back over learning for children who have missed school. In January, we are starting to use a new software package called curriculum provision map which costs all our interventions and support. This will allow us to target our resources to maximise children's progress. However, we will prioritise children who we know are going to be in school otherwise it is waste of money and would be unfair on parents who understand the value of school attendance.

The letter I send to all parents will have a copy of your child's register over the past three years and will also tell you how many days your child has missed since starting at Our Lady's. I think parents will be surprised what the absence adds up to as there are some children who have missed more than a term of school. Moving forward we will alert parents once their children's absence goes beyond half a term, then a term and so on.

Please remember that 5 days absence includes 2.5 hours of phonics (KS1), 5 hours of literacy and 5 hours of numeracy. They will never get these back and it puts your child at an immediate disadvantage. The two most important indicators to children's academic achievement at GCSE is their reading level at age 7 and their attendance.

I understand that these are difficult times. However, children have already suffered enough and been asked to make incredible sacrifices. It is really important that parents don't compound this by not ensuring they attend school at every possible opportunity.

Reception Admissions 2022 - 2023

A quick reminder that admissions for Reception 2022 are open but close shortly after Christmas. Please remember that you need to fill in a form for school as well as applying in the normal way through Buckinghamshire Council. Forms are available in the school office, and in the local parishes.

Our Lady's PTA




