<b>Beatles</b> - A very popular group through the 1960s and 1970s. Perhaps Britain's most famous band ever. <b>Hippie</b> - A name used to describe people who dressed in a very trendy way <b>Clangers</b> - A very popular TV programme for children in the 1960s and 70s. <b>Crackerjack</b> - Another very popular children's programme that was on BBC on Friday nights. Famous for a quiz where children had a cabbage. <b>Moon landing</b> - The first man landed on the moon in 1969. He was called Neil Armstrong <b>McDonald's</b> -The first McDonald's opened in England in 1974	<b>Emily Pankhurst</b> - Born in 1858 she fought for women to have the right to vote <b>Suffragette</b> - This is the name of the movement that fought for equal rights for women <b>Mary Prince</b> - She fought for the abolition of slavery and was the first black woman to have an account of her life published in Britain <b>Mary Seacole</b> - Born in 1802, she also became famous for looking after injured soldiers <b>JK Rowling</b> - A famous author who wrote, the Harry Potter series <b>Marcus Rashford</b> - A footballer who plays for Manchester United and is campaigning to make sure all children have food each day	<b>Moat</b> - An area of water surrounding the castle <b>Drawbridge</b> - A special entrance that could be lifted or opened <b>Knight</b> - In the olden days a knight would be a special soldier who wore armour <b>Turret</b> - A small tower which is part of the main castle <b>Keep</b> - A central area in the castle where the important people would have slept and ate <b>Portcullis</b> - A heavy iron gate that can be raised or lowered at the entrance to a castle
