<p>biome - Distinct biological communities that have formed in response to a shared physical climate</p> <p>canopy - Can be over 30 m above the ground and made up of the overlapping branches and leaves of rainforest trees</p> <p>understory - A tangle of shrubs, young trees, saplings, palms and vines</p> <p>biodiversity - Variety of plant and animal life in a particular habitat</p> <p>temperate - A region or climate characterised by mild temperatures</p>	<p>sustainability - About our actions having a lasting effect on the environment and we should protect it for our future generations</p> <p>global citizenship - Working as a community to look after the world</p> <p>ethical codes - A set of moral principles used to govern the conduct of a profession</p> <p>developing country - A poor, agricultural country that is seeking to become more advanced economically and socially</p>	<p>Pampas - The pampas are fertile South American lowlands that cover more than 750,000 km²</p> <p>Incas - The Incas, an American indigenous people, were originally from the southern highlands of Peru</p> <p>street children - Groups of children with no homes or parents, who are forced to beg for a living</p> <p>anaconda snake - Semiaquatic snakes found in tropical South America</p> <p>Andes - The world's longest continental mountain range</p> <p>I am Somebody - Poem which was used in a campaign to bring attention to the street children of Brazil</p>	<p>The Golden Mile - The name given to the long promenade which many people stroll along</p> <p>Blackpool Tower - When it opened in 1894, the Tower was the tallest man-made structure in the British Empire</p> <p>Wakes - The name given to a holiday period associated with different towns in Lancashire</p> <p>Promenade - The long area associated with the walkway running along the coastline in Blackpool</p> <p>Lytham St Anne's - A large town near Blackpool which also attracts many holiday visitors.</p>

deforestation - When forests are cut down and the area is permanently cleared for another use

cooperatives - Groups of people who agree to work together to sell a product by following fair trade principles
Fairtrade premium - An extra sum of money to invest in improving the quality of producers' lives

Blackpool illuminations - A period, usually between September and January, when 6 miles around Blackpool is illuminated by lights.
