grid reference - Numerical grid references consist of an even number of digits. Eastings are written before Northings

aerial photograph - Aerial photography is the taking of photographs of the ground from an elevated/direct-down position

time zones - Time zones give specific areas on the Earth a time of day that is earlier or later than the neighbouring time zones

map symbol - Used to represent real objects. Both shapes and colours can be used for symbols on maps.

cartography - The study of maps and map making. Someone who makes maps is called a cartographer.

The 'Big Apple' - This is the nickname associated with New York City (NYC). The nickname has been popular since the 1920s.

Chichén Itzá - Chichén Itzá is a complex of Mayan ruins in Mexico. It is a massive step pyramid.

A buck - A nickname for the American dollar.

Statue of Liberty - The Statue of Liberty is a colossal neoclassical sculpture on Liberty Island in New York Harbour in New York City.

Empire Windrush - One of the first ships that brought workers from the Caribbean to Britain.

Indian subcontinent - The Indian subcontinent is a physiographical region in Southern Asia, situated on the Indian Plate, projecting southwards into the Indian Ocean from the Himalayas.

Afro-Caribbean - A person of African descent living in or coming from the Caribbean.

Brexit - The withdrawal of the United Kingdom from the European Union

greenhouse gases - Gases that trap heat inside the Earth's atmosphere

global warming - A greenhouse effect, resulting in the increase in global temperatures

ozone layer - An invisible layer of protective gases that circles the Earth

methane - A greenhouse gas produced by cows and landfill sites
