Empire - An extensive group of states o monarch mother country - The UK was often refemembers of the British Empire		Axis - Countries which fought on the German side, including Italy, Germany and Japan		Immigration - Coming to live permanently in a foreign country  Prejudice - Preconceived opinion that is not based on reason or experience  Caribbean - The region consisting of the Caribbean Sea, its islands (including the	

Commonwealth - An international association consisting of the UK together with states that were previously part of the British Empire, and dependencies **Colony** - A country or area under the full or partial political control of another country and occupied by settlers from that country

**Slavery** - Often associated with the early formation of the British Empire Empire on which the sun never sets - At one time the British empire expanded across the world so that there was always somewhere where the sun shone (in other words was not night-time)

Allies - Countries which fought on the British side during WW2 (including the USA, Great Britain, France and Russia

Propaganda - Controlling news media (such as radio) to depict the war effort **No Man's Land -** The area between the two sides during battle.

Armistice Day - The day the agreement was signed between the Allies and Germany to end the WW1 on 11<sup>th</sup> November

Conscription - A rule that said all healthy men aged 18 – 41 had to fight

Windrush generation - People arriving in the UK between 1948 and 1971 from Caribbean countries – many travelled on MV Empire Windrush

**Asian community -** People living in different parts of the country having originated from Pakistan, India and Bangladesh
