How to help at home

- Please encourage children to be adventurous in their reading choices.
- Please make sure your child knows their tables to 12, including the inverse, and can apply them to other calculations, eg 0.8x7.
- Ask them to show you their written methods of calculation for multiplication, division, subtraction and addition.
- Encourage children to use numeracy skills as much as they can outside school – particularly help with fractions, coordinates, percentages and units of measure.
- Practise estimating and rounding to 2 decimal places.
 Help your child to memorise how many grams in a kilogram; millilitres in a litre; days in a year; yards in a mile; feet in a yard etc.
- Find some time each week to read with your child and discuss the book together.
- Use a thesaurus to find synonyms and antonyms.
- Help them to revise their weekly spellings.
- If possible, take them to the library where there is a much wider choice of books to help develop their appreciation of a variety of authors and styles of writing.
- Help them to practise their research skills using the internet.

Literacy – In Literacy this term, we will be developing writing in particular through the following forms of writing: writing in role, non-chronological and chronological report writing, presenting a balanced argument and comparing poems.

The children need to focus on the following skills in particular:

Text organisation, structure and a good range of punctuation.	
Grammar, including word classes; passive voice in formal	
writing; different types of the present and past tenses, fronted	
adverbials, main clauses and subordinate clauses.	
Evaluating, editing and improving work.	

Numeracy – This term we will be focussing on the following key skills:

Calculations- mental and written		
Derive quickly squares of numbers to 12 * 12 and the		
corresponding squares of multiples of 10.		
Express a larger whole number as a fraction of a smaller one		
(e.g. %5or 13/5); simplify and order fractions.		
Solve multi-step problems, and problems involving fractions,		
decimals and percentages.		
Select and use standard metric units of measure and convert		
between units using decimals to two places (e.g. change 2.75		
litres to 2750 ml, or vice versa).		
Use the language of Imperial measures.		
Use approximations and inverse operations to estimate and		
check results.		
Find area and perimeter .
