BOUNDARIES OF THE PARISH OF OUR LADY OF PERPETUAL SUCCOUR, CHESHAM BOIS (2015 clarification)

These descriptions are intended to be read in conjunction with an Ordnance Survey 1:50,000 scale map, and a 1:25,000 one if possible, and possibly a large-scale street map.

Beginning at the most northerly point and running clockwise

- 1. Starting from a point on the B485 road between Chesham and Great Missenden, approx. 100m east of where the lane to Hawthorn Farm joins the road from the south. Grid ref 932014. See Map A for points 1-5
- 2. From here, generally eastwards along the line of the B485 but running south of it so as to exclude all farms and houses fronting onto the road.
- 3. Where the B485 adjoins the western end of the residential road Ryecroft Rd on the SW edge of Chesham, turning SE and skirting along the southern edge of all the houses in the built-up area of Chesham leading off Missenden Road and Fullers Hill, so as to exclude them.
- 4. Turning NE along the eastern edges of the football ground and cricket pitch so as to exclude them, and thus to the roundabout on the A416 Amersham Road.
- 5. Across the roundabout onto Moor Road (south side only) to where it is crossed by the Chesham Little Chalfont railway
- 6. South-east along the track of that railway to where it is crossed by Raans Road on the east of Amersham
- 7. SW along Raans Road (north side only) to where it meets Woodside Road and Stanley Hill/White Lion Road at the double roundabout under the railway bridge
- 8. From here, west along the track of the railway to where it is crossed by Hyrons Lane. See Map B for points 8-11
- 9. SSW along Hyrons Lane (west side only) and east along Highlands Rd (south side only) then SSE along Westanley Avenue (both sides), briefly west along Stanley Hill Avenue excluding all houses fronting onto it, and south along the rear gardens of houses fronting onto Cedar grove so as to exclude them
- 10. West and south along the rear-gardens line of houses fronting onto Highmoor so as to exclude them, then south along the rear-gardens line of houses fronting Hundred Acres Lane until the northern edge of the third house up on the west from the junction with First Avenue, turning east along that boundary so as to include those three houses which are numbered as being part of First Avenue.
- 11. South down the end of Hundred Acres Lane (west side only) and turning briefly east, south, east and south again to include all houses fronting onto First Avenue and Chequers Hill running west from the roundabout.
- 12. From the centre-point of the A404 /A416 roundabout, by a bee-line SW to the point where New Road running NW out of Coleshill meets the A404 Whielden Lane SW of the Crematorium. See Map C for points 12-14
- 13. From here, across the A404 and following a pylon line NW to where it enters woodland by the electricity sub-station site NW of Woodrow High House. From there, by a NW bee-line a little more northwards to meet Mop End Lane just south of the SW tip of woodland (High Wood) west of Shardeloes house.
- 14. Turning NE and NNE along Mop End Lane to where it meets the A413 dual carriageway east of Little Missenden. Jinking slightly east to cross the A413 and

continue NW as a lane through Ash Grove and Lott's Wood, and then NW across fields to Weedon Hill Farm

15. Passing south of Weedon Hill Farm to include it, and continuing NW parallel with Weedon Hill but so as to exclude all houses associated with Hyde Heath village. At the school, turning north, passing east of the houses (excluded) and running along the lane that leads to Hawthorn Farm. Passing the Farm on its east (excluded) and thus to our starting point on the B485.

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Main villages and neighbourhoods included: Chesham Bois: Amersham Crematorium, Amersham Old Town, Amersham-on-the-Hill, Mantles Green, Shardeloes

Excluded (for the avoidance of doubt): Amersham Common, The Bury, Chesham, Coleshill, Hyde Heath, Latimer, Little Missenden, Pednormead End, South Heath, Waterside, Woodrow

Developments: No substantial housing developments are likely in this hilly and intensively-settled Green Belt area.
