BOUNDARIES OF THE PARISH OF ST AIDAN, LITTLE CHALFONT (2015 clarification)

These descriptions are intended to be read in conjunction with an Ordnance Survey 1:50,000 scale map, and a 1:25,000 one if possible, and possibly a large-scale street map. Beginning at the most northerly point and running clockwise

- 1. Starting from the point where the Bucks/Herts county boundary crosses the minor road between Ley Hill and Bovingdon
- 2. Following the county boundary south and east for a long distance, skirting around the built-up area of Chorleywood and thus excluding it . See Map A
- Where the county boundary meets Burtons Lane west of Chorleywood, running westwards along it (north side only) until its crossroads with Lodge Lane / Roughwood Lane
- 4. From there, by a bee-line due west, passing north of Pollards Park House so as to exclude it, to the south-west corner of the Quarrendon Farm complex of buildings (included)
- 5. From here, by a bee-line almost due north to the roundabout of the A404 and A413 south of Amersham. See Map B for points 5-8.
- 6. North from the roundabout so as to exclude all houses fronting onto First Avenue and Chequers Hill running west from the roundabout. Briefly west along the rear gardens line of houses in First Avenue and turning north along Hundred Acres Lane, east side only for the first three houses on that roads which are numbered as if they were in First Avenue. At the northern edge of the third, turning west and running north along the rear gardens line of houses in Hundred Acres Lane so as to include them
- 7. Then turning west and running along the rear gardens line of houses in Highmoor so as to include them
- 8. Turning north along the rear gardens line of houses in Cedar Grove so as to include them. Across Stanley Hill Avenue so as to include all houses fronting onto it, then NE along the rear gardens line of the three houses on the east of Westanley Avenue so as to exclude them. Briefly west along Highlands Road (all houses included) and north along Hyrons Lane (east side only) and then turning east along the track of the railway.
- 9. Following the railway eastwards until it is crossed it crosses the double-roundabout junction of Raans Road / Woodside Way and the A404 Stanley Hill / White Lion Road.
- 10. NE along Raans Road to where it crosses the Chesham-Little Chalfont railway
- 11. Following that railway track as it curves north and NW to the point where it is nearest to the sewage works in Latimer Road SE of Chesham. See Map C
- 12. By a bee-line NE to pass by the edge of the sewage works and continuing on to our starting point on the Bucks/Herts county boundary

Main villages and neighbourhoods included: Little Chalfont: Amersham Common, Chenies, Latimer

Excluded (for the avoidance of doubt): Amersham, Botley, Chortleywood, Chorleywood West, Coleshill, Ley Hill, Sarratt,

Developments: No substantial housing developments are likely in this hilly and intensively-settled Green Belt area.
