

Well done everyone and good luck at the finals next week.


<u>Northern Lights</u>


Our lovely neighbour sent this beautiful picture of the Northern Lights this morning.


St Aidan's - Saturday 6:15 pm; Sunday 9 am (Polish Mass) and 11 am




The first First Communion classes will be held this week in both Our Lady's and St Aidan's - you should have received details of these classes if you have registered your child.
