Reading


How long can your child sit and read for?

As your child gets older, you will probably find you listen to them read less. It is still important to listen to them read on occasion. However, a good indicator for how well they can read is how long they can sit and read in one stint. It is very interesting when I go around the classes watching them during the accelerated reader time. Some children find it really difficult to sit and really get immersed in a book. This is something that the children have to develop and the only way is to make sure they have time every day away from distractions (the television or computer games) to read.






Christingle Crafts & Music, 21st December, 3pm at Our Lady's




