### **Early Reading and Phonics**

Next week, the phonics groups will really get going. When they do, your children should be bringing three reading books home. They will all be matched to their phonics level. You will get two books that the children use in their phonics lesson (the one they are doing at the moment and the next one). They will also have a book which they have chosen themselves. This is matched to the other books. It is important to remember that it is good practice to read these books multiple times.

**Reading with you child every day will help to develop good reading habits.** These habits are the best indicator you have to how your child will do in GCSEs and A-Levels.






