Safeguarding - Attendance

This week, as part of my safeguarding messaging, I am just reminding parents about attendance. All the evidence is that children who are more vulnerable tend to have poorer attendance, which is why we are required to monitor it so carefully. The table below shows how many lessons children miss even if they have relatively good attendance. We normally start getting concerned if your child's attendance drops below 90% but as you can see they will already have missed 100 lessons.

85%	29 days	150 lessons
80%	38 days	200 lessons

It is really important, as parents, to remember that children never get those lessons back. Every time they are off they are disadvantaged compared to their peers, so they should only be absent if it is completely unavoidable.
