

### **Curriculum – Treading the Wheat Field**

In school, we often talk about treading the wheatfield. This is the process of overlearning and practising until we make a change in long term memory. It is a bit like walking through a field of wheat. The first time there will be a bit of a path, but the wheat will probably move back. However, if you walk the same path every day eventually the path will become permanent.

The evidence on 'overlearning' seems to suggest that repeating a task to the point where almost no thought is required in its completion is a good way to change long-term memory:

Overlearning refers to the continued practice on a task after some criterion of mastery on that task has been achieved. A pianist, for example, might continue to practice a piece despite already being able to perform it. (<u>Soderstrom & Bjork, 2013</u>)

So, what does this mean for parents. Well, there is an enormous curriculum to learn and there is no way that parents can support 'overlearning' for the whole thing. However, it does highlight the importance of ensuring your child reads every day and practises their multiplication tables regularly. As they get more fluent, like the pianist, it frees up their working memory to learn other more complex concepts.

When the children go to secondary school, being a fluent reader, means they are concentrating on the knowledge they need to learn rather than trying to read.


