Dear Parents,

I've been away for 3 days this week working with another school, but I imagine as the staff here are so good you probably haven't even noticed. However, I know it has been a really busy week.

On Wednesday, the Faith Ambassadors went to St Michael's for training along with Mission Teams from the south of the trust. The theme was the upcoming Jubilee Year 2025 – Pilgrims of Hope. The children did lots of different activities which hopefully they will be able to bring back into school to do with the other children. They then looked at planning a Celebration of the Word based around Pilgrims of Hope. The children do a lot more planning of prayer and liturgy and it is great that they can work with Jane Porter, the trust Chaplain, to refine their skills even further.

Then yesterday, the Minnie Vinnies organised a tea party for some of the elderly in our wider community. The feedback was absolutely amazing! As well as being important for our children, it really is important for the elderly people some of whom have the start of dementia. There is a lot of research now in how the company of children can really help. It was really nice to see the legendary Mrs Haines back in school. For those who don't know she was a teacher here for many years and was "acting" head at least three times. She was so impressed and passed on the following message to me:

"It was "unbelievable" how the children conducted themselves and how much joy they communicated to all those around them. The team behind was also amazing. The Holy Spirit is visibly at work at OLS. Love and blessings. X" We also had some lovely feedback from a prospective Reception parent this week who had a tour of the school. He said to Mrs Cid-Fuentes "This school is extraordinary. Normally you go into a school and they take you into the classrooms with the well behaved kids and the best teachers. But here every single place you've taken us the children are behaving: in the classrooms, corridors at playtime. Every child knows you and all the teachers know every child. The atmosphere is amazing and you can't fake that." It is really nice to get feedback like that from a complete stranger. So, thank you for all for having such wonderful children because believe me it is not all down to a school.

With two lots of feedback like that, I should stay away more often!

## Year 6 Careers Fair - Can you help?



St Aidan's - Saturday 6:15 pm; Sunday 9 am (Polish Mass) and 11 am




The first First Communion classes will be held this week in both Our Lady's and St Aidan's - you should have received details of these classes if you have registered your child.
