The children will be bringing home their Rosary Challenge sheets to tick off when they have completed each story.




Thank you for your continued support and I hope you enjoy taking part in the Rosary Challenge with your children.


St Aidan's - Saturday 6:15 pm; Sunday 9 am (Polish Mass) and 11 am


