Dear Parents,

This week has been Science week and what a great week it has been! There has been so much emphasise in schools over the last few years about curriculum and having carefully planned progression etc, which has been great but these are the weeks the children will remember. These sorts of weeks make education "an experience" and one that will stay with the children forever.

The theme for this year's science week has been butterflies. All the children have learned about different butterflies and we have been out to see them in their natural habitats. Even better than that, we have seen some real successes where we have been out earlier in the year doing some butterfly conservation work. This week, we have learnt that butterfly lifecycles are a bit more complicated than in "The Very Hungry Caterpillar", and that caterpillars are actually very fussy eaters. Over the next few weeks, we will be planting some plants in different areas which will attract different types of butterfly. It is a great way of improving the biodiversity in our environment. Hopefully, we can build this work into our curriculum in the future as it really has helped to take the science curriculum beyond primary expectations. I would like to say a massive thankyou to Mr Weatherill and Paul Stack from Chiltern Forest Rangers who have planned the whole thing. I have only heard positive things from staff and children particularly after coming back from their trips out.

Also this week, we celebrated The Ascension with Our Lady's Parish. It was a lovely Mass and several of the parishioners told me how uplifting it was to see the children there. As you can imagine, the children were impeccable. Most schools wouldn't believe that you could have Reception and Year 1 children sitting and concentrating for that amount of time. Well, at Our Lady's we can. Please pass on my thanks to your children.
