News From The Parishes

Last weekend was the Solemnity of Christ the King and I know that there were lots of opportunities for our children to be involved across the parishes.

St Columba's

I was at St Columba's on Sunday evening for the Youth Mass where many of our children were involved in the procession, reading, the offertory and the choir. Once again it was a lovely joyful Mass and I know some of the children also had the opportunity to go to the Youth club the evening before.

Children's Liturgy at Our Lady's Church

Since the end of October, the time of our Sunday morning Mass has changed from 9:30 to 9:00. As a result of the change, we have been able to move the Children's Liturgy back to the guild room for the first time since before lockdown. We're delighted to have the extra space to allow us to explore the liturgy in new ways, working together and learning the day's Gospel through craft activities, colouring and singing as well as listening to and discussing the Gospel story. The children return to church for the offertory procession, in which they all participate, offering their drawings and crafts as well as the bread and wine at the altar (their handiwork is returned to them at the end of Mass).

Children are welcome to join us from the age they are able to sit and listen until they have made their First Communion. For younger siblings, we also have an area containing some suitable toys and books for them to use if they need a bit of time out at any point, and Fr Roy is having a speaker installed in the guild room so parents can still follow the Mass.

This Sunday, we will be lighting the first candle on our Advent wreath and starting a very special Advent activity to prepare our hearts for the coming of Jesus at Christmas.



St Aidan's Nativity


