
## **PTA NEWS**


# **NEU Teachers Strike**

## **Parent Questionnaire**

Thank you to everyone who completed the Catholic Inspectorate parent questionnaire. It is really useful for us. There were responses from 49 families. This is a summary of the results:



These are really positive results. There were a small number of neutral answers and a very small number of negative answers. It is a shame that the colours are a bit confusing but unfortunately, I don't have any control over that.

There were a few really useful comments. Some really positive comments which I will use going forward on the website and generally when I'm promoting the school. There were also some comments which we will hopefully be able to use as part of our school improvement. A few of these I can answer/address here:

#### There was one request for more notice for Masses and liturgies.

This is something we will certainly endeavour to do moving forward. We will try and make sure they are always on the app and I will make sure a message goes out before. You can always assume you are invited unless you are told otherwise. Very occasionally we may

need to encourage parents not to come because of capacity but the majority of the time it is fine.

# There were also a couple of comments saying either the parishes should be supporting the school more or the school should try and involve all of the parishes.

Hopefully, this is something that has been addressed now with two relatively new parish priests. We can be restrained by what parish priests want to do or what they feel their skills are. However, we now have two excellent parish priests and are trying to encourage them to be as involved as possible. We are at times mindful of their workload too.

#### One parent requested that the children learn more about vocation and ordination.

This is a topic that is covered in the curriculum but it tends to be in Year 6. So hopefully they have that to come.

The other area that we will look at comes from the answer about whether you know how your child can improve in RE.

I know how well how well my child is doing in RE and what they need to do to improve.



This is something we will look at particularly as we move to the new RE Curriculum directory set out by the Bishops of England and Wales. Once again, thank you to everyone who took the time to complete the questionnaire.

# A Message from Ten Ten Resources January 2023


