

White Hill Centre – Could you host some Italian children?

White Hill Centre is looking for up to ten local families to host Italian Junior & High School pupils for two weeks in July. These pupils attend Catholic Schools in Rome and Southern Italy and stay in groups of two. Our annual language groups have been organized for the last 35 years by a British Language Professor resident in Italy and currently in Matera, previously Rome, University: Stanley Robert Krol, ex-Preston Catholic College and University College London. Mr. Krol travels with the groups, which have always been based in the White Hill Centre in Chesham.

Each group of 2 boys or girls stay as paying guests in a local host family. We expect breakfast, a packed lunch to go and an evening meal, plus light laundry. All pupils are out almost daily, from 8.30 am to around 9 pm., and are transported to and from White Hill in the teachers' rented cars. The pupil's presence is limited to breakfast and late dinner times and an occasional Sunday. A written daily program is provided.

Arrival in Chesham Car Park (behind Boots) is around 9.30 pm on 6 July and departure 9 am on 20 July. The daily contribution per pupil is £30: thus £210 per week per pupil, or £840 for the entire fortnight in double occupancy. Mornings are considered lesson time at White Hill, while afternoons generally alternate Central London tourism with local activities. Note that many of the pupils become genuinely friendly with host families and often return every summer, even for 3 or 4 programs.




