Key Stage 2 SATs


Well done to last year's Year 6 whose provisional progress results have been released this week. They are absolutely exceptional:

The score means that the children's average scaled score is, for example 4.13 in reading, above that of other children in England. Overall attainment and achievement is really impressive being in the top 10% in every measure and the top 5% in most.

Reading

Following on from thinking about Key Stage 1 reading last week, we are talking a lot to Year 5 and Year 6 children about their stamina for reading. As I am sure you are all aware, we use a system in school called Accelerated Reader which means we know all the children are reading. However, ensuring the children are reading quality books which build up their reading stamina can be really difficult if parents aren't taking an interest in what their children are reading. It is really important that the children build up their reading stamina as, when they start doing English exams, they are going to need to read novels which they wouldn't always choose themselves. Having the stamina to just read for their learning is really important. Children must be able to sit down and persevere with a novel over a few weeks. Sometimes parents find it difficult to know whether their children are reading the right books so just a reminder that we have book lists for each year group on our website:

Reading & Phonics - Our Lady's Catholic Primary School (olschesham.co.uk)

Each year group has three lists with list A being the easiest and list C being the hardest. However, even the easier lists will build up the children's stamina.

There is a direct correlation in how well the children do in their tests and how many words they are reading. The children reading the most words aren't always doing the most quizzes. It is also down to the types of books they are reading, which is where you as parents come in. This is the most important thing that you do, and the one that is often forgotten, once children can read independently.


Ten-Ten Resources
