Early Reading and Phonics

Next week, the phonics groups will really get going. When they do, your children should be bringing three reading books home. They will all be matched to their phonics level. You will get two books that the children use in their phonics lesson (the one they are doing at the moment and the next one). They will also have a book which they have chosen themselves. This is matched to the other books. It is important to remember that it is good practice to read these books multiple times.

Reading with you child every day will help to develop good reading habits. These habits are the best indicator you have for how your child will do in GCSEs and A-Levels.

Attendance

The school attendance for last week ending 13th September was 98.3%. We only had one week last year with attendance above 98% so this is absolutely fantastic. I cannot reiterate how important this is for the children's learning but also their future employability as they develop good habits.



Extra-Curricular Clubs

We have had unprecedented numbers of children wanting extra-curricular clubs this term. In particular, the free clubs run by staff. Where we can we are paying some of our teaching assistants to help in the clubs so that we can include more children but some of the clubs still can't take all of the children. In these cases we have split it so that we have two groups one for Autumn Term and one for Spring Term. This way you can see if there are any other clubs with less children in that your child may want to take advantage of.
