PTA AGM






St Aidan's - Saturday 6:15 pm; Sunday 9 am (Polish Mass) and 11 am





Assisted Suicide Bill

The second reading of the Leadbeater Bill will be on Friday 29 November and will be accompanied by a vote on the principles of the Bill. Cardinal Vincent Nicols, the leader of the Catholic Church in England and Wales, has written a Pastoral Letter for all members of Catholic communities which you can read or listen to here:

Pastoral Letter on Assisted Suicide - Diocese of Westminster

All the Bishops of England and Wales are calling for Catholics to inform themselves as to the dangers of this Bill and, crucially, to contact their MP to make their opposition known.
