Doodlemaths

Just to let the Key Stage 1 parents know that our subscription for Doodlemaths comes to an end at the end of March. It is quite expensive and Numbots and Timestables Rockstars are not only better for the children's fluency but also a lot more reasonable. You can carry on using Doodlemaths at the moment, but we will send out the information again about Numbots to you in the next few weeks. Once the children complete Numbots, they can move onto Timetable Rockstars. If you really liked Doodlemaths, there are options for parents to purchase it themselves. Unfortunately, the current usage in school didn't justify the £750 a year for the school.

Gareth Southgate - The Richard Dimbleby Lecture

Over the last few weeks there have been two television programs which are really worth watching if you have teenage children, or as many of us have, children who haven't quite reached there yet. I would highly recommend the Richard Dimbleby Lecture with Gareth Southgate particularly if you have boys as I do. Gareth reflects on some of the challenges for boys in this new world of social media.

There is also the Netflix series Adolescence. This series has sparked a public conversation about the challenges facing young boys and men today, particularly in relation to toxic masculinity, misogyny, incel culture, and online radicalisation. Although this might not be relevant to your children now, it may do in the future and earlier this week I shared some resources for parents. I hope you find them useful.


Every runner will donate £5 towards the cause for every run they complete.


We meet up every afternoon in the park at around 16:15 and run an easy 5km. So come join us in the challenge and complete a run with us!





March 2025

March marks the beginning of Lent, a time in the Church that focuses on prayer, fasting and almsgiving (charitable giving). This year also brings the added invitation to explore and grow our friendship with God through the celebrations of the <u>Year of Jubilee</u>.

The season brings an exciting opportunity to slow down, put the most important things first and experience the joy that God offers each one of us.

This newsletter shares some of the content children will experience in school throughout March, and suggests ways for you to engage with them about it. We hope it is a useful resource for your family prayer time.

JUBILEE JOY: FREEDOM

Our Lent series of Celebration of the Word Assemblies begins by exploring the Year of Jubilee theme of slavery and freedom. Inspired by Jesus' temptation in the desert, children will explore how we can all be 'slaves' to things that distract or stop us from following in God's way. Children learn about the true freedom that God offers all people and that when we put God first, we can experience the freedom that only God can give.

With your child/ren, you might like to...

- Read the account of Jesus' 40 days in the desert together (Luke 4:1-13), and notice how Jesus found the strength to say 'no' to temptation.
- Discuss the habits, thoughts or temptations that you would like to be freed from and how you might support one another in achieving this.
- Research the Jubilee themes shared in March: forgiveness, managing debt, care for creation and restoration of the family.
- Listen to our prayer reflection song for the Year of Jubilee 'Song of Hope' by One Life Music that has been made available in the <u>Parent Portal</u>. You might like to talk about how experiencing freedom, hope and joy helps you to grow your friendship with God before you listen.

MORE TO THE STORY

Jesus knows that we need help to understand God's way, so He taught using parables. During the week beginning the 3rd of March, in the Celebration of the Word Assembly, children will discover how Jesus' stories give us clues on how to live holy lives and love others like God loves.

You might like to take this opportunity with your child/ren to...

- Play a game of charades, acting out different fairytale stories and then talk about the moral or lesson that the story teaches.
- Use the Prayer for Peace in your family prayer time to invite God to help you love others, even when it is difficult.

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace:
where there is hatred, let me sow love;
where there is injury, pardon;
where there is doubt, faith;
where there is despair, hope;
where there is darkness, light;
where there is sadness, joy.
Amen

JESUS, SHINE YOUR LIGHT

The prayers for the week beginning the 17th March use religious artwork to reflect on aspects of Jesus' nature. Inspired by the Transfiguration, where some of the disciples witnessed Jesus' face shining, children will consider how artists have expressed Jesus' divine, Godly nature through their work, to help others know Him.

Through exploration of the images, children ask Jesus - the King, our teacher and friend - to shine His light and enlighten our minds so we can understand more about Him.

You might like to use this prayer as you pray together:

Jesus, you are with me as I pray. Shine your light on me today. Amen
