Dear Parents,

It is lovely to celebrate Holy Week in school. Each morning we started the day as a whole school dramatising the Station of the Cross using the music Born For This by CJM. It gave us a chance to remember Jesus' journey to His death but at the same time to remind ouselves that Jesus died so that we can live our lives to the full. It is good to remind the children that we need to be joyful to really live our lives to the full.

This week, some of the children also had the chance to take part in the Adoration of The Blessed Sacrament. I have to be honest when Federica first mentioned it to me I was a little sceptical. But how wrong I was; it was absolutely beautiful. We started with the staff over lunch time, and then had a group of children from each class. The children sang, prayed, read scripture and just sat quietly at times. We finished with Father Dave processing around the school and blessing each class. Not all the children got the chance to take part this time but we are hoping to do it more regularly. I want to thank Father Dave for facilitating this by bringing the real presence of Jesus, the Eucharist, to school.

Curriculum – Core Knowledge

At school, we have designed a curriculum with core knowledge and skills which progressively get harder and more complex. Your child's learning is like a Jenga tower with each concept building on previous learning in previous years, terms, weeks and days. The more gaps, the more likely it is that the tower falls. That is why it is really important that we keep reinforcing previous learning and it is really helpful if you talk about the children's learning and previous learning regularly. It is also why it is really important that your child is in school every day possible as every day that is missed adds multiple gaps in their Jenga tower.



















March 2024

Perfect Promises

Throughout Lent, our assemblies follow the theme of God's Perfect Promises.

Continuing from last month, in March children will explore themes of guidance, presence and belonging connected to stories from the Old Testament.

All these help children to understand that Jesus is the fulfilment of God's Perfect Promises. Because of Jesus' death and Resurrection (that we anticipate in Lent and celebrate at Easter) we can be close to God and have a relationship with Him!
