## September 2023 – PE Days

I just wanted to give parents prior warning for a slight change in policy around PE days and PE kits. As of September, children will be able to come into school on PE days in their PE kit. This will help to maximise the time children are active in PE lessons. It will also help avoid trying to separate boys and girls for changing as they get older. This can be difficult as we don't have changing rooms.

Hopefully, by letting you know now it might help you make decisions around the amount of uniform that needs buying as they tend to be wearing uniform for 3 days and PE kit for 2 days. The children will be expected to wear school PE kit. If they need a warm top they should wear a school fleece. If they need tracksuit bottoms then they will need to wear plain black tracksuit bottoms.

The final benefit of this is that the children will normally wear their PE kit into school and then home which means there is likely to be less lost property.

The only year group where there won't be a change is reception. This is mainly due to the fact that learning to get changed is an important skill that they sometimes pick up from copying their peers.



This newsletter shares some of the content children will experience in school throughout June and suggests ways to support your family prayer times.








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## **Accelerated Reader**
