Deputy Primary Minister: Molly Culligan


I look forward to working with them over the next year.

Safeguarding - Attendance

This week, as part of my safeguarding messaging, I am just reminding parents about attendance. All the evidence is that children who are more vulnerable tend to have poorer attendance which is why we are required to monitor it so carefully. The table below shows how many lessons children miss even if they have relatively good attendance. We normally start getting concerned if your child's attendance drops below 90% but as you can see they will already have missed 100 lessons.

90%	19 days	100 lessons
85%	29 days	150 lessons
80%	38 days	200 lessons
75%	48 days	250 lessons

It is really important, as parents, to remember that children never get those lessons back. Every time they are off, they are disadvantaged compared to their peers so they should only be off if it is completely unavoidable.

Parking

Unfortunately, I'm having to write again to parents to ask them to park considerately in the local area. I have had two letters from local residents recently and sadly the last one was from someone who had missed an important hospital appointment because they couldn't get out of their drive. What is more embarrassing is that they spoke to the parents who were just rude to them. This really is unacceptable and I have had emails from other parents who are equally frustrated with the lazy parking of a small minority.

I realise it is difficult because we are a very successful school with a wide catchment area so lots of people drive. However, if you are so busy and in such a rush that you can't walk the extra few hundred metres then you probably should be sending your children to a school much nearer to your home. Selfish parking certainly doesn't fit in with the Christian ethos of this school and is setting a really bad example to your children.

Furthermore, I still have a small minority of parents who think they are busier (or maybe special) than other parents so they feel they have a right to park in the car park at the beginning and end of the day. A few parents/grandparents with blue badges have permission but nobody else should be parking there. It is really dangerous and, once again, selfish. If you are dropping off to breakfast club **before 8.15** or collecting from after-school club **after 5pm** then it is fine but otherwise there is no reason to park there. I have asked the office to start adding a £10 parking charge to ParentPay for parents who park in the car park without permission.

I am very sad to have to write this letter because most parents at this school are fantastic and always set their children a really good example.
