## A message re parking

Unfortunately, we have had another complaint from a neighbour in Clifton Road who is rightly concerned about the dangerous parking at drop off and pick up. Please take time to read what she has said and consider whether you may be able to help us improve the situation, by altering your own routine.
> "Myself and members of my family are continually prevented from leaving Clifton Road safely because of the appalling parking. Cars are often parked on the double yellow lines close to the junction with the main road, meaning that cars leaving and entering Clifton Road are forced into a head on position, as there is no space for 2 cars. Cars are continually double parked and pavements are blocked. Only this morning I was forced out into the road with my dog, as a parent was completely blocking the pavement. I asked her if she realised she was blocking the pavement and explained that there were plenty of safe parking spaces further along the road. She said that she didn't have time to drive along the road to park more safely. It seems there unless this problem is addressed there is a strong possibility of an accident happening."

I fully understand that getting children up and out in the morning is not easy, but it would help enormously if older children could be dropped off in Clifton Road just before 8.30am. They can walk round with you, or with friends if you feel they are responsible enough, and play in the playground from 8.30am, which would allow Clifton Road to be clearer for the younger years.

We have a similar problem with parents trying to park in the staff car park and, as school SENCO, I would appeal to you not to do this. There are some children with disabilities who need to park in the school car park. Unfortunately, there have been several occasions recently where these children have not been able to park in the car park as the spaces have been taken by others who do not have any reason to be there.
