Attendance





Although we were above the national average, on the whole we aren't at our target of 98%. Hopefully, as time goes on this will improve as at the start of the year one day off is a high percentage as we have only had about 35 days so far.

Well done to the 115 children who still have 100% attendance but there are 20 who have had more than 3 days off which, currently, would make them a persistent absentee. Obviously that isn't going to be a problem as long as you don't have 3 days off every half term.

FSM6 are children who have been in receipt of free school meals in the last 6 years. Nationally, the statistics show that these children will attend less well and therefore attain less well at school and in particular are less likely to achieve good GCSE's. I do not want this to be the case for children at Our Lady's however, as you can see from the table above, at the moment it is.

I cannot emphasise enough the importance of your child coming to school every day. Every day of education they miss is a day they will never get back. In an effort highlight this I will share this report with you regularly.

Safeguarding - Lockdown

This week, we practised our very first lockdown at the request of the MAT. The children were brilliant and we actually had a very simple procedure where everyone went to the nearest classroom. We could then check that all the children were inside.

It didn't work quite so well for the adults as I forgot to let Miss and Mrs Burke know that it was finished and they spent about 15 minutes hiding in the PE cupboard. Maybe needs a little bit of refinement.

Just so you know I talked to the children about using lockdown if there was a gas leak or maybe a dog had got onto the playground as I certainly don't want to scare or alarm them.


