There is quite a high chance that we will have significant staff absence due to the requirement to isolate. I would therefore ask families to continue to be vigilant and test your children if they are feeling under the weather. If they don't feel 100% but test negative then they are still fine to come to school. We all have days where we don't feel 100% and I think we have moved past the point in the pandemic where we need to keep children off school just in case.

This week was the first time in a long while that the Epiphany Holy Day of Obligation remained on the 6th January itself. In recent years the Bishops have moved it to the nearest Sunday. This did give us the opportunity to start the term with Mass. As I said to the children, we will be the only school in Chesham and Amersham celebrating Mass today and it is the time when I am most proud as a Headteacher. The children were absolutely fantastic. They read clearly, sang beautifully and behaved impeccably.






St Columba's Youth Mass
